In planning your program, remember that William Jessup University can neither accept more than 70 lower division units nor more than 1/2 your total number of units for this major. Those courses numbered 300-400 at William Jessup University are best taken at William Jessup since they are upper division classes. However, WJU is willing to accept as equivalent, three lower division classes as satisfying upper division requirements, with no more than one of those courses within the chosen concentration. In cases where lower division credit is used to satisfy an upper division requirement, students will be encouraged to audit the course at WJU in order to be fully prepared for the comprehensive exam.

Students completing four years of the same second language during high school will be allowed six units of humanities electives to meet the second language requirement.

Courses within the Liberal Studies major for which no transfer credit will be accepted include: Teaching as a Profession, upper division curriculum & methods courses, and student teaching courses.
